What does a school-issued Outlook account include?

What are the risks?

Because of this, potential safety concerns include risky contact with strangers and online predators. Make sure your child tells you who they're talking to online and let them know they can come to you if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable.

Another concern kids may face is cyberbullying. Kids sometimes use group chats and email threads to purposely exclude other students to make mean-spirited comments and spread rumors about them. Remind your child about the importance of kindness and the value of inclusion with their peers.
